

Woodhouse Photo Collection at the University of Sydney, Australia

Alex Economou, a reporter at Neo Kosmos newspaper in Australia, has given our community a unique opportunity. At the University of Sydney, Australia, there is a magnificent collection of 1,500 photographs of early 20th Century Greece. They were taken by William Woodhouse, who was the University's classics chair. He travelled frequently to Greece and took photos of the country between 1890 and 1935 -- before its modern, industrial era, and before massive numbers of tourists discovered its beauty. However – he did what many of us do and later regret – he did not add captions to the photos.

Alex wrote: *Is there any chance that you could possibly ask conference participants to have a look at the pictures?*
